Marriage: Contact Parish Priest/Office at least six (6) months before the proposed wedding date.





Why does our Consecration to Jesus have to be through Mary his Mother?

We bring glory to the Father by freely choosing Mary, His masterpiece, as the means through which we come into a deeper union with His Son Jesus.

Lenten Regulations in Our Catholic Faith

- 1. It is God's law that every human being does penance.
- 2. The meaning of fasting and abstinence in the Catholic faith:

Abstinence mean's that a person abstains from eating meat of any kind. (beef, chicken, pork, or other meat). Only fish is permitted. Fasting means eating only one full meatless meal in the day. Some food may be eaten at the other two meal times, but all combined they should be less than a full meal. A stricter fast is good if persons are able to do so.

- 3. When and who must fast?
 - All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, unless for serious health reasons. However, fasting is recommended for all who are younger or older and are able to do so.
- 4. When and who must abstain from meat?

All Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. However, it is highly encouraged that children under 14 also observe abstinence as a matter of good discipline. Another note: although fish and sea foods of all kinds, are not meat, Friday is always a day of penance and one should not have a fantastic shrimp dinner, or other sea food feasts, simply because you are permitted to by law.

Lent / Confession

Lent, .. this is the season in which we place special focus on the conversion of heart. It is a time of penance and interior renewal to enable us to prepare for Easter, the Resurrection, the New Life, the New Beginning in Christ. The Church's liturgy unceasingly invites us to purify our souls and to begin again. Returning to the Lord our God with all our heart is the message of Lent. As the priest places ashes on our forehead, he reminds us of the words of our origin... "remember man, you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

God wants us to detach ourselves from the things of the earth, fleeing from deliberate sin,... and holding onto one much greater, God Himself. He desires that we abandon sin which destroys relationships with Him, ourselves and others. He is looking for a sorrowful heart within us, a heart that acknowledges its weaknesses and sins and is prepared to separate itself from them. Due to our sorrow and, above all, our trust in Our Lord's loving kindness we embrace the holy gift of mercy, pardon and strength in the sacramental of confession (Reconciliation). During Lent, each of us should make a good confession, the most profound and effective gift of God's mercy. To confess one's sins at least once a year is one of the five precepts of Our Catholic Faith. It is right and proper to frequently confess due to our frequent falls to temptation.

To encourage our sorrow, the Church sets before us, in the Ash Wednesday liturgy, the words of King David who gave utterances of his repentance. We can equally pray:

"Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness, oh wash me more and more from my guilt, and cleanse me from my sin. My offenses truly I know them; my sin is always before me.

Against you, you alone, have I sinned: what is evil in your sight I have done.

A pure heart create for me, oh God; put a steadfast spirit within me.

Do not cast me away from your presence, nor deprive me of your Holy Spirit.

Give me again the joy of your help; with a spirit of fervor sustain me.

O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth shall declare your praise." (Psalm 51)

God will listen to us as we humbly offer this prayer; he rejoices as we humbly confess our sins. Conversion is shown in all our life, our thoughts, our words and actions. In practice, each person should prayerfully draw up a particular plan of Lenten Resolutions to offer to God every day during this holy season, as we prepare for the Easter Resurrection.

Lenten Practices To offer to Our Heavenly Father / A Preparation for a Holy Easter

Lent is a time to change, to be renewed, to be freed from sin and all that is not good in our lives so that our hearts may be made more worthy of Jesus. All sin is directed against GOD...SELF...or OTHER PEOPLE and there are three corresponding ways to be reconciled and overcome these sins; PRAYER... FASTING... and ALMSGIVING. Resolutions during the 40 days of Lent are valuable for making up for sin and renewing relationships with all, while living a holier life with Jesus our Lord God and Savior.

Possible Lenten Resolutions

SINS AGAINST GOD: We make up for these sins by PRAYER.

- 1. Pray the family Rosary every night. (Get extended family back together!)
- 2. Attend daily Mass as a Family, or a couple of daily Masses a week besides Sunday.
- 3. Be extremely obedient to Our Beloved Heavenly by keeping holy the Lord's day by worshiping Him every Sunday of the year.
- 4. Take 15 minutes a day for quiet, personal time, simply visiting with our Lord Jesus, talk to Him in a personal way, and then...be sure and listen as He speaks to your heart.
- 5. Read the Bible for 20 minutes a day with your spouse, children, or a friend. Discuss what you read and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in understanding.
- 6. Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet daily.
- 7. Make a Holy Hour regularly in adoration of our Lord Jesus in our Adoration Chapel.
- 8. Praying morning and evening prayers each day.
- 9. Seek the forgiveness and mercy of Jesus by making a good confession. If it has been many years the priest will be very happy to help you to receive this wonderful gift of love and mercy, peace and reconciliation.
- 10. Pray the Stations of the Cross each Friday in the Church remembering the suffering of Jesus.
- 11. Thank God daily in prayer for His goodness to you.

Prayer is the great gift which renews our life in Jesus and daily opens our hearts to the abundant graces which God desires to pour out into our life. Pray <u>WELL</u> and find great strength and peace within!

SINS AGAINST SELF: We make up for this sin by FASTING (or other acts of self-denial).

- 1. Remember to abstain from eating any meat on Ash Wednesday and <u>all</u> the Fridays during Lent. Fasting from food is required for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting can also be from some special kind of food you enjoy like sweets, coffee, bread with your meal, ice cream, or whatever you enjoy. Self-denial builds self-control.
- 2. Fasting from television, computer, internet, i-phones etc. and make better use of time.
- 3. Make time for family instead of using it for your "own time" and doing things you like to do.
- 4. Fast from alcohol. (And ONLY in moderation after Lent.)
- 5. Stay away from the Casino and use your money in works of charity.
- 6. Only buy what you need, and not merely what you want.
- 7. Eat more simply.
- 8. Deny yourself a night out or a movie.
- 9. Examine your life and look at what you like to do, eat, places you like to go, things you like to have... and deny yourself any of these.

As we deny ourselves even simple things of the day we are strengthened in our emotions and our free will to choose what is good and refrain from what is bad... and God is pleased to grant us the extra needed graces.

SINS AGAINST OTHER PEOPLE: We make up for these sins by ALMSGIVING (or acts of charity).

- 1. Bring a person to Sunday Mass who usually doesn't come, or who doesn't have a ride.
- 2. Give more generously to the financial needs of the Church according to your ability.
- 3. Give extra to the poor locally or needy throughout the world.
- 4. Visit the sick, lonely, or shut-ins.
- 5. Pray for those who have hurt you. Pray for those you have hurt.
- 6. Write a letter to an old friend.
- 7. Refrain from gossip or hurtful thoughts and words.
- 8. Say a kind word rather than a harsh look.
- 9. Build people up rather than cut them down.
- 10. Apologize to those whom you have hurt, even though it was a long time ago.
- 11. Do something special for a parent, child, or neighbor.
- 12. Cook a meal, or help an elderly person in their daily needs.
- 13. Teach a child their prayers.
- 14. Be always honest and truthful, and respect all people in your thoughts, words and actions.
- 15. Visit a neighbor or family and pray with them, especially at Mass together and the daily Rosary.
- 16. Visit with someone you dislike or who dislikes you.
- 17. Invite someone to Mass with you.

As we consider sins against our neighbor, we find that we overcome these by living out the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, and in so doing, we are reconciled in broken relationships. Peace can then return among one another and within our own hearts.

PERSONAL LENTEN RESOLUTIONS

Now it is time to **prayerfully** ask God what it is He desires you to change in your life and what Lenten practices you should make to grow closer in love with **GOD**, **NEIGHBOR**, **AND SELF**. Make resolutions in each of the three areas. You don't want to overdo it so that you can't keep the resolutions, but don't be too soft on yourself either, or you may not grow. We all have room to grow, and often, a lot of room.

After your time in deep prayer, write down your Lenten resolutions to overcome sins against God, Self and other people to grow in a deeper and more loving relationship with all. Keep this close to you and read through it in your daily prayer. This is between you and our Lord Jesus. Nobody else needs to know unless you want to share it with a priest. (Parents, it is good to help children to make such resolutions).
